Property section

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Council, in 2015, resolved to comply with the NSW Online Road Naming User Guide & NSW Addressing User Manual published by the Land & Property Information (LPI) and Geographical Names Board (GNB) of NSW (copy attached of extract). The GNB website address is www.gnb.nsw.gov.au and may be of assistance with more information.

For Council to fulfill obligations as a road naming authority under the Road Act 1993 application must be made on the attached form.

Road name requirements

In accordance with GNB & LPI Addressing/Guidelines the following information must be provided:

- 1. New Road Name(s) Application Form to be completed.
- 2. Provide Road Type e.g. Street, Road etc. See table below to assist in determining the type.
- 3. All applications must suggest one (1) new name and alternative one (1) in case your first choice is rejected by GNB or Council, state reasons to support suggestions. The history/reason for the name(s) chosen must be included.
- 4. Proposed road name(s) should have a maximum length of nine letters (excluding the suffix), should be appropriate for the physical environment, historical and/or cultural character of the subject area and represent the values of the community and be mindful of future generations. Euphony will also be considered when determining appropriateness of proposed name(s)
- 5. All **applications must be accompanied by an annotated GIS map or survey plan** and sufficient particulars to enable the road to be identified.

Fees charges – payable prior to release of subdivision certificate

- In accordance with GNB Online Road Naming User Guide, all road/street names must be advertised in the local newspaper (as both a proposed name and again after GNB approval), then advertised in the NSW Government Gazette (after GNB approval).
- The advertising costs are paid by the applicant as per the current Port Stephens Council Fees and Charges Schedule.
- If objections are lodged and an alternate name needs to be selected there may be additional costs associated with any extra advertisement of the amended road name request.
- To maintain equity, the additional disbursements associated with the naming of roads will be charged, by invoice **payable prior to the release of linens**, at cost plus GST.

Definition of road types (by GNB guidelines)

a) Cul-De-Sacs

Suffix	Abbreviation	Definition			
Close	CL	Narrow passageway leading from a Street to a Court			
Court	СТ	Uncovered area wholly surrounded by buildings or walls			
Cove	CE	Small cul-de-sac or court			
Grove	CR	Roadway ending in a square having a group of trees stranding together			

b) Open Ended Streets

Suffix	Abbreviation	Definition		
Alley	AL	Narrower than a street for people or vehicles in cities and towns; a minor thoroughfare through the centre of city blocks or squares		

Arcade	AR	Passage having an arched roof, or any covered passageway, especially one with shops along the sides			
Avenue	AVE	Broad passageway planted on each side with trees			
Boulevard	BLVD	Wide street or avenue, well paved, usually ornamented with trees and grass plots			
Chase	СН	Road leading down to a valley			
Circle	Cl	Thoroughfare which forms a circle or part of a circle			
Circuit	CC	Road or way enclosing an area			
Circus	CS	Circular open place where many streets come together			
Crescent	CR	Thoroughfare in the form of a crescent or half moon			
Drive	DR	Wide thoroughfare allowing a steady flow of traffic without many cross streets
