

Roundabout beautification — Lemon Tree Passage Road and Avenue of the Allies

In late 2020, we showed 3 concepts of different styles of roundabout beautification. The feedback we received, the vast majority of respondents preferred to 'keep it simple' — similar to the concept shown below.

We are now looking at a combination of a simple, central structure and some landscaping featuring suitable plants.

The final design will be available on our website before works begin.

The works will be completed with the Avenue of the Allies shared path project in mid-2021.



Henderson Park, Lemon Tree Passage

We will soon be installing a new shade shelter over the deck seating near the jetty and tidal pool at Henderson Park.

The shade sail will be designed to match the existing shade structure over the playground.

This project is being funded by the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.







Works are currently scheduled to begin in September 2021.

Peace Park, Tanilba Bay




We will soon install a new public barbeque at Peace Park near the playground and public toilets. Later in the year, we'll undertake additional works to improve the car parking facilities, replace vehicle barriers and improve turfed areas for passive recreation.

This project is being funded by the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program and Port Stephens Council.

Key milestones

-  Mid-2021 — shared paths construction start
-  August 2021 — Mallabula active hub construction upgrades begin
-  October 2021 — main construction period ends and ready for play!
-  October to November 2021 — family fun day and official opening (date to be set)

New shared pathways, a skate park, a playground, a multi-sport court and much more are on the way for the Tilligerry Peninsula in 2021, thanks to funding from the Australian Government, NSW Government and Council's PS2020 projects fund.

Mallabula Sports Complex

The Mallabula Sports Complex will be transformed into an active hub for all ages featuring a playground, multi-sport court and skate park.

This new equipment will be connected via paths and will include supporting facilities such as a toilet, park furniture and event space. Please see the site layout over the page.

The playground will cater for younger children (0 to 8) while the multi-sport court and skate park will provide year-round fun for all ages.

We'll also be upgrading the soccer/athletics building and constructing a new tennis court to the west of the existing courts.

Works are scheduled to begin in August 2021.

Shared paths

Mallabula to Lemon Tree Passage

This new shared path will allow people to safely access Mallabula Sports Complex.

The wide path will be about 2 metres wide and will be constructed along Lemon Tree Passage Road and Kawarren Street. It will join the existing pathway network.

Avenue of the Allies

This new shared path connection will run along the eastern side of the road between the 2 historic gates. It will be located between the tree line and houses.

The 2.5 metre wide shared path will begin at the southern gates end and head north.

Timing

Construction of these shared pathways is currently scheduled to begin in mid-2021.

- 1 Skate park — design subject to upcoming skate park workshop
- 2 Playground — designed for 0 to 8 years
- 3 Multi-sport court catering for basketball, netball, futsal, soccer and handball
- 4 Toilet — accessible unisex single cubicle
- 5 New shared paths (2.5 metres wide) and footpaths (1.2 metres wide)
- 6 Pedestrian crossing — including speed humps, boomgate and lighting
- 7 Seating area and bubbler
- 8 Picnic tables — new slabs with existing furniture to be reused
- 9 Gravel car park with vehicle barriers
- 10 Event space — including vehicle and power access
- 11 Vehicle barriers — to prevent unlawful vehicle access and damage
- 12 New bin
- 13 Tennis court expansion — not shown, details on our website
- 14 Soccer and athletics building upgrade — not shown, details on our website
- 15 Existing skate park, playground and BMX track to be removed
- 16 Future paths not included in current works (unfunded)
