Little Beach improvements

We're getting closer to completing the improvements at Little Beach, with most of the road and shared path works now finished.

Upgrades to the park are also almost complete with irrigation installed to help reinstate the parks open grassed areas.

The new general amenities are open and in use while we continue constructing the changing places amenities.

As part of the improvements, we're also replacing the fish cleaning table, which includes:

- wheel chair access
- solar lighting
- improved pedestrian access
- eight cleaning stations

The location, size and design of the new fish clean table has been made with future car park improvements in mind.

Thank you to all of our nearby residents and park users for their ongoing patience while we complete this major park improvement project.

Fingal Bay park upgrade and amenities

We've listened to the feedback from the Fingal Bay community relating to the new amenities building for Fingal Bay Foreshore. In the new design the amenities block will feature 2 change rooms, an accessible family room, 2 unisex toilets, and an ambulant toilet.

We're looking to secure the contract before Christmas with a completion date prior to Easter 2024.

The privacy screening on the outside of the new amenities block will feature a Fingal Bay headland mural artwork.

These amenities are another addition to the recent works around the Fingal Bay foreshore precinct, including the updated park furniture and connecting paths. Work is due to commence on the furniture after Easter next year with the view to have all work completed prior to July 2024.

Marine Drive landslip rectification

We've almost completed works along Marine Drive, Fingal Bay, following the landslip that occured during storms in March 2021. We're constructing a retaining solution along the landslip zone and formalising the current stormwater solutions in the area, to help prevent future incidents during high rainfall weather events.

The permanent one-way traffic arrangement will ensure better pedestrian access to connect Fingal Bay Foreshore to Barry Park and to the Tomaree Coastal Walk.

Play spaces

Brand new playgrounds are set to be installed at Tomaree Sports Complex, Korora Oval and Taylors Beach prior to July 2024.

The playgrounds at Tomaree and Korora will be local spots that kids and families can now enjoy along with local sporting clubs and their spectators.

The new playground for Taylors Beach is in its draft design phase with the playground set to bring new appeal to the waterfront for families that can also enjoy the BBQ's and picnic table settings.

Teramby Road, Nelson Bay

We have funding to rectify the 2 landslip sites on Teramby Road. Works have begun at one site with more works to come in 2024.
