

Karuah – Aliceton Reserve and Memorial Park



Background

The Karuah Place Plan was adopted in early 2022, creating actions to improve the liveability and wellbeing of people living, working and visiting in Karuah. We're developing designs for 2 of the identified project sites from the Place Plan – Memorial Park and Aliceton Reserve.



How we got here

In developing the Karuah Place Plan and listening to the community, we learnt that some of your priorities for the area are:

- Quality of public space
- Spaces suitable for specific activities or special interests
- Walking, jogging, bike paths that connect housing to communal spaces
- · Access and safety when walking, cycling and on public transport





Aliceton Reserve concept designs

The map above outlines some of the existing facilities at Aliceton Reserve, as well the possibilities for the use of the recreational space including playgrounds, amenities and shared pathways. Your feedback will help us make decisions about upcoming works in those spaces as well as helping us to shape the future of the area.

Memorial Park works

Council will be constructing a short stay RV parking area in Memorial Park including an RV dump point. The old playground and public toilet will be removed as part of the upgrade. Public amenities are available at Longworth Park and are in future plans for Aliceton Reserve.

The project is funded by the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund.
