Closebourne Way, Raymond Terrace - Request for parking restrictions

Requested by: A resident 388390

Background:

A local resident has contacted Council with concerns regarding the intersection of Closebourne Way and Mount Hall Road. When coming out of the estate, cars parking adjacent to the intersection make it difficult to see oncoming cars on Mount Hall Road. Construction of Irrawang High School's additions are causing more traffic to park near the school, and is causing safety concerns.

Comment:

It was noted that there are currently no signposted restrictions on Mount Hall Road side of the intersection. 'No Stopping' could assist to ensure that sight distance was available for vehicles turning right from Closebourne Way.

It was also suggested to add continuity line so that drivers can safely move forward to see oncoming traffic.

Committee's recommendation:



Robinson Street, Anna Bay - Birubi shuttle bus

Background:

Council is proposing to implement a shuttle bus service at Anna Bay to transport tourists from select locations within Anna Bay to Robinson Reserve carpark.

The shuttle will operate between select locations within Anna Bay where commuters can safely park their vehicles for extended periods and hop on a shuttle bus to the beach.

The purpose of the service is to allow people to visit Birubi Beach and Robinson Reserve safely and conveniently and without the concern of getting caught up in the traffic congestion on James Paterson Street.

The shuttle Bus will run between the hours of 10am to 5pm during peak holiday periods of the year.

Discussion:

The following comments were received from Busways:

- o It is highly possible that coaches visiting the area may choose to park at this proposed bus zone (even though parking is not permitted in a bus zone)
- o It may be worth considering a particularly short bus zone to suit your minibus but that would prohibit the parking of 12.5m, 13.3m and 14.5m coaches
- o I'm not sure whether the *Minibus Zone* signage is gazetted in the NSW regs of the ARR's but I have seen them around this could also be a possibility


