# Topaz Avenue, Medowie – Request for parking restrictions

# Requested by:A local residentFile:421817Background:

A local resident has requested a review of parking at the rear gate of Blueheath Retirement Village in Topaz Avenue, Medowie. The resident reports issues with the width of the road and difficulties for vehicles turning in the 'no through road', especially when other vehicles are already parked there. Vehicles have damaged trees, pipes and reversed into their car in the driveway whilst trying to manouevre. Vehicles have also been observed mounting the kerb onto the footpath.

#### Comment:

It was observed on inspections that the pavement width is approximately 8m, making U-turn manoeuvres difficult, especially if vehicles were parked on both sides of the road. There is also an access gate to the park which would be blocked when vehicles are parked there. 'No Parking' signage could assist in maintaining space for safer turning and for maintenance access to the park.
